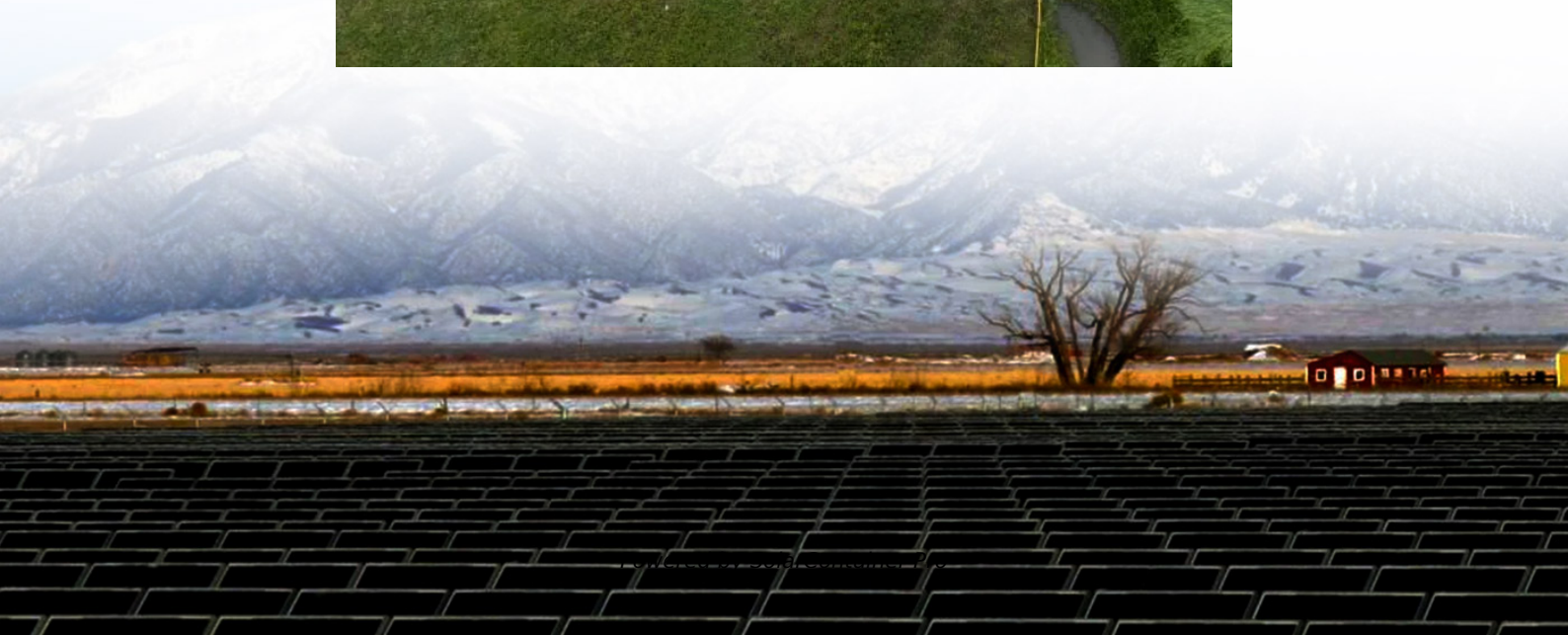


How many communication base stations are there in Uganda





Overview

How many radio stations are there in Uganda?

Since liberalization of airwaves in Uganda in the mid 1990s, there have been mass waves of radio stations. There are over 150 radio stations countrywide. To date, radios are now in almost all major towns in Uganda, reaching all sections of people in the society.

Why did Uganda establish its first radio station?

The reasons for setting up a radio station in Uganda were similar to those at the Gold Coast, now modern-day Ghana (Head 1979). In 1954, the first radio named the Uganda Broadcasting Service was established by the British colonial government (Matovu March 1990, Kiwanuka-Tondo 1990). English was the dominant language on the station, with a few Ugandan languages also broadcasted.

How many people use mobile phones in Uganda?

By June 2018, the total number of mobile telephone users in Uganda, was 23.6 million, or 57.6% of the 41 million population, according to the Uganda Communications Commission. As of March 2010, telephone traffic within is carried by wire.

How many phone lines are there in Uganda?



In 2018, there were 368,243 main telephone lines in use in Uganda, making Uganda one-hundred and eighth in terms of countries having the most main telephone lines. In 2016, there were 22.838 million mobile telephones in use, making Uganda fifty fourth in terms of countries having the most mobile telephones in use.

Does Uganda have a phone service?

The use of phones and the internet in Uganda has rapidly increased in the last few years. The postal service of for the protectorates of British East Africa and Uganda was called East Africa and Uganda Protectorates, and operated from April 1, 1903, to July 22, 1920.

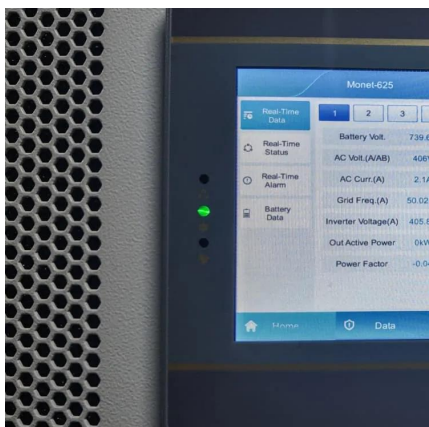
